John Walton - Pioneer

John Walton started playing rugby in grammar school in England in 1950 at the age of 13. He continued to play school rugby, culminating his school career as captain for which he was awarded a tankard in 1954, and followed up with one more year as part of the school old boys' team in senior rugby.

In 1956, at the age of 19, John first came to Canada to train as an Royal Air Force (RAF) pilot returning home in 1958. At the conclusion of his RAF service, John returned to Canada in1959 locating in Winnipeg, where he married in 1960 and began to raise two sons with his wife Joan.

It was during the mid sixties that John was to revive his passion for rugby. Along with Derry Newton, John was to begin playing rugby again and together they were instrumental in reviving the local Winnipeg Wanderers Rugby Football Club. The club at that time practice on Churchill Drive and travelled throughout the province of Saskatchewan and the northern United States to play the game they loved. It was the revival of the Wanderers RFC that was to serve as the catalyst for club rugby in Winnipeg as shortly thereafter the Winnipeg Wasps Rugby Football Club was formed, followed by the Assassins and Saracens Rugby Football Clubs.

John continued to play rugby in Manitoba for many years, was President of the Manitoba Rugby Union in its early days during the later sixties, and was a stalwart contributor to both his club and the sport. Following his retirement as a player, John took up the art of refereeing which continued at the club and high school levels following his move to Vancouver for work in 1983 and again following his retirement from work and return to Winnipeg in 1993.

John's contributions as a Pioneer to the development of rugby in Manitoba are indeed worthy of distinction and induction to the Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame.

Jeff Harrison - Player


Jeff Harrison started his rugby career in grade 12 at St John's High School, and at the age of 17 played for the Manitoba Rugby Senior Men's team in 1976. He certainly would be one of the youngest players to be selected to play for the Manitoba Senior Men's team in the Western Canadian championships.

Better known as Beaver, Jeff continued playing senior men's club and provincial team rugby, building a career spanning some twenty years. Jeff had been an excellent hockey player and after finishing his commitment to Junior hockey devoted his time to the sport of rugby while studying to be a school teacher.

Jeff was part of the Saracen RFC team that toured New Zealand in 1980 during which he played in all six games at standoff. Along the way he caught the attention of two clubs that attempted to persuade him to remain in New Zealand and play for their senior teams. Returning from New Zealand, Jeff was instrumental, that same year, in engineering Manitoba's upset defeat of Alberta in the Western Canadian Championships.

Jeff represented Manitoba provincial rugby in several sequential Western Canada Senior Men's Championships and on the strength of his ability and play was invited to Western Canadian All-Star camps in 1981, 1982 and 1983. During this era, however, it was a requirement of Rugby Canada that players east of the Rockies relocate and play in British Columbia if they were to have any aspirations of expanding and developing their careers with an ambition of playing for Canada. For Jeff this requirement was neither viable nor attractive as he was starting out on what would become a successful career in teaching and, like his commitment to Junior Hockey, he had developed an even stronger commitment to Manitoba and Saracens rugby.

This was all to Manitoba rugby's gain as Jeff continued playing for the province until 1993 and Premier 1st division club rugby until 1996. Jeff was the only Saracen to appear in all eleven of the Premier 1st Division Championship final victories the Saracens enjoyed between 1979 and 1992.



Jeff was a player of exceptional natural ability and this was certainly recognized by friend and foe alike. He was quick, agile, had excellent vision and possessed an extraordinary ability to beat a player one-on-one in a variety of ways. There was always a spontaneity about his game. Whether it was executing the perfect feigned kick, a dummy pass or just a lateral step at pace, he was able to leave his opponent clutching at thin air. There was an element of innovation about his game too and, for example, his basketball pass when the circumstances called for, came naturally to him, even though it did the so-called purist somewhat disturbed.

In summary, Jeff's spontaneity, innovations, quickness, pace and his deft eye for the 'opportunity' made him one of the best attacking players the Province of Manitoba has ever produced.

Angela Ploegman - Player

Currently residing south of the border in the state of lowa and looking to start a youth rugby program in Scott County, **Angela Ploegman** enjoyed a relatively short but remarkable playing career during the 1990's. Her talents on the field were to garner her the respect of players and coaches alike, lead to national attention, and serve to inspire other young women in Manitoba to not only play the game, but to pursue it to the highest levels.

Angela played eight seasons (1990 – 1997) with the Wanderers Rugby Football Club serving throughout that period as the team's captain or co-captain and leading the team to 3 consecutive Women's Provincial Championships in 1995, 1996 and 1997. During this same eight year span, Angela played for the Manitoba Senior Women's Team and served as team captain from 1995 to 1997.

Her provincial team exploits were to garner Angela national attention when she was invited in 1995 to attend the Rugby Canada Under 25 National Women's Development Camp in Victoria, BC. Making the most of that opportunity, Angela was long listed for the Canadian Women's National Team in 1995, 1996 and again in 1997. In 1996 Angela was short listed for the Canada Cup in Edmonton, AB. where she earned her 1st Cap in a game played against France. This was to be followed in 1997 when Angela was again short listed for the Canada vs US Eagles exhibition game in Toronto, ON. and employed as a substitute against the US Eagles A team.




In addition to her accomplishments as a player, Angela served as Vice-President of the Women's Rugby Division in 1998 and added to that, time dedicated to the coaching ranks. In 1994 Angela, along with Krista Barkman and Shannon Ploegman, started the girl's rugby program at Mennonite Brethern Collegiate Institute (MBCI) where Angela remained to co-coach the team for three years. In 1997, St. Mary's Academy girls program was to see Angela as its new head coach and during the 1996 and 1997 seasons, Angela served to coach the Wanderers RFC Colts' team.

Angela was an impact player blessed with an impact personality. Few who crossed her path were spared her rugby laud, with many taking up the cause and strapping on the cleats to play the game we love.

1972-75 Saracens Rugby Football Club - Team

The foundation of this successful Saracens team was the four pillars or "founding fathers" of the Club, with a dedicated and colourful supporting cast. Enthusiastic imports and local Canadians combined to forge the Saracens early and consistent success. Imports included Peter Press, a coach whose eloquent demands and punishing practices developed stamina for the long run, and Ken Adams, whose combination of shifty speed and smart play bewildered opponents and taught the rookies. Home grown talents were Howie Goss, whose tenacity and heart anchored the pack, and Gerry Nufer, whose uncompromising competitive nature sparked the team.

Founded in 1968 and capturing senior men's Premier provincial championships that year and in 69, plus 2nd Division championships in 69 & 70, by the early 1970's the Saracens "train" was building steam for six Premier Provincial championships in its first eight years, four occurring consecutively from 1972 to 1975. In an era when few locally played the game, with no substitutions or injury replacements, commitment was high to not only field a team, but to win consistently. The Saracens club was adept at both attracting imports and developing local talent, converting football players to the sport. With strong 1st and 2nd Division teams, and at one point two 2nd Division teams, the Scimitars & the Sabres, the Saracens demonstrated great recruitment and talent, the depth of which was to show for many years to come.

Commitment described the Saracens and its 1972 to 1975 team. Commitment:

- to the exhausting Churchill Drive practices with backs carrying forwards up the hill on their shoulders, and Peter's favourite finale, the "run to the pumphouse...and back!";
- to each other, on and off the field, as a band of brothers;
- to the club, playing, touring and winning;
- to the game, a revelation to many, and;
- to the league, as evidenced in supporting events of other clubs, high school rugby, hosting touring sides and initiating SNAFU, a tournament tradition that continues to this day.

Club records from the time show commitment to events hosted by other clubs with Saracens urged to support them, and that support actively reciprocated by other clubs annually competing at SNAFU. As one of the top tournaments in North America, SNAFU regularly drew teams from Georgia, Chicago, Minneapolis, St. Paul, Kansas City, Regina, Saskatoon, Edmonton, BC, and farther afield from London and the Caribbean. Starting in 1971, and still going, SNAFU offered opportunities to compete and celebrate the game. Each local team hosted a visiting side that built league solidarity in a long weekend of competition and camaraderie, establishing longstanding inter-city connections that exist to this day.

Stamina was essential as both practices and games were contested at a high level. Inter-squad games were as tenacious as league games, followed by great camaraderie, a rugby tradition. In an era of no substitutions, one was expected to finish the game, and then drink a beer with your previous foe of a few moments ago, and now a very fine fellow. The league was smaller then, so chance meetings around town were cause for celebration with club members or opponents.

The team's high level of play was recognized by the League, with Saracens regularly placing many players and coaches on provincial sides for Inter-Provincial competitions. Also of note were hard fought contests, with world class touring sides, Lliannelli in 1973 and Lansdowne in 1974. As the team to beat, the 1972 to 75 Saracens helped raise the level of competition to the point where other clubs captured Premier Provincial championships during the years of 1976 to 1978.

Farther afield, the Saracens and the 1972 to 75 team tested their stamina and metal by going on tour. Facing other teams, differing tactics and strategies helped build Saracen skills. The team toured actively, south, starting with frequent trips to Chicago, then Dubuque, Madison, Minneapolis. Annual tours west included Regina (Prairie Cities) and Saskatoon (Louis Riel Days), with open invitations to come to SNAFU in mid-summer.

Off the field, these same Saracens fostered high school rugby, as players took time to coach high school teams at Sisler, St. John's, Sansome, Westwood, Garden City and Transcona Collegiate. Many in the Saracens' successful "second wave" of 1979 to 1986 were players who started their rugby careers at Sisler and St. Johns High Schools.

The Saracens 1972 to 75 team built upon a solid foundation, with commitment to the game and each other. They lived up to it, on and off the field. It was a club and team that grew stronger year after year and served to elevate both the development and caliber of the game and the league in the province of Manitoba for future years to come. The Saracens 1972 to 75 team are proud partners of the growing history of rugby on the Prairies.

Hall of Fame

Rob St. Germain - Builder

Rob St. Germain was to launch his "legendary" rugby career in 1972 following the promise of free food and beverage as a guest of the Wasps Rugby Football Club, to watch rugby game films at the old Carling's Brewery. A teacher at Glenlawn Collegiate, Rob was to play his first game that year against the Assassins Rugby Football Club at Hubic Field. But that was just the beginning, as Rob went on to play for another 34 years with both the Wasps RFC and the Legends before he retired as a player in 2006. Rob's contributions to the sport of rugby, however, go well beyond his exploits as a player.

As one of the founding members of the Legends Rugby Team, Rob and his cohorts provided a much needed opportunity for older players to continue playing competitive rugby in 3rd Division, the team winning the 3rd Division Provincial Championship in 1992 and recipient of the Manitoba Association of Rugby Referees "Spirit of the Game Award" in 1994 and 1995.

In addition to serving as Captain of Wasps RFC teams several times over the years, Rob coached the Wasps RFC in 1978, coached Fort Richmond Collegiate high school boys' rugby teams during the first years of high school rugby operations, coached the first women's rugby teams in Manitoba at the high school level at Fort Richmond Collegiate in 1978/79 and the senior women's club level with the Wasp Women's Athletic Association.

Playing and coaching were not enough for Rob as he served his club in the capacities of President, Vice President and Board Director for several terms over the years. In addition, Rob was the original webmaster of www.waspsrugby.com, the first rugby webpage in Manitoba, and continued on as the club's webmaster for over 20 years updating and authoring much of its content.

In 2003 and 2006, Rob was part of a three member organizing committee that successfully ran the Rugby Canada Junior National Championship Festivals in Winnipeg. The success of the 2003 festival was to result in Rob being recruited by Rugby Canada in 2004 to provide assistance and help run the Junior National Championship Festival in Hamilton, Ontario when local volunteers were experiencing organizational difficulties.

One of Rob's proudest moments was to see the establishment and construction of Maple Grove Rugby Park (MGRP) in 1985. Following its establishment, Rob served for many years as the bar manager, organized a major fundraiser for the park by hosting a Rugby World Cup event in 2007 and would go on serve as President of MGRP from 2009 to 2014.

Rob's long tenure and his many and varied contributions to the sport stand him in elite territory as one deserving of induction as a Builder in the Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame.

Today, Rob volunteers his web based talents to the Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame having created its website www.manitobarugbyhalloffame.com and serving as webmaster.

Wasp Women's Athletic Association - Builder


For 34 years, the mandate of the **Wasp Women's Athletic Association** (**WWAA**) was to "Promote Women In Sport". This unique Canadian organization encompassed various sports with women of diverse ages, skill levels and abilities. It provided an opportunity for women to play organized sports after high school. There have been hundreds of women who have enjoyed the benefits of participation in sport over the years thanks to the WWAA.

Over the lifetime of the WWAA there were 6 different sports in the organization: baseball, team handball, rugby, volleyball, soccer, and touch football. It was one of the first clubs to be grandfathered into working Bingo fund-raising events. In 1985, the WWAA was one of the founding members of Maple Grove Rugby Park (MGRP) and was an active member there for many years. The association also supported members from Club level at both Provincial & National levels. Members were always the first to volunteer for many rugby events such as the Western Canada Summer Games (1990), the Canada Rugby Cup (2000), and hosting the Venezuelan women's rugby team.

The WWAA was founded in 1976 with the sport of baseball. The camaraderie experienced by that team led to the addition of Team Handball. The popularity of Team Handball grew and there were up to 4 teams at one point. The team participated in out of town tournaments as well as hosting a number of local outdoor handball tournaments at MGRP. In 1980-81 a group of WWAA members also played Volleyball. Soccer and Touch Football were two more sports that were added to the WWAA's endeavors with MGRP serving as their home field.

In 1979, WWAA team handball members Betty Wilson and Karen Campbell Rhoda, with help from others, took on the challenge of recruiting two women's rugby teams. The formation of these 2 teams, the Wasps and the Wanderers, signified the birth of senior women's rugby in Manitoba. That first WWAA rugby team had four courageous coaches, Riley Barkman, Rob St. Germain, Cole Summers and Ian Murray, who were tasked with coaching an entire team of rookies.

The WWAA Rugby team thrived. They captured a number of Manitoba Women's Provincial Championships (1985–1988, 1990–1992 and 2001) and were always well represented on the Manitoba Senior Women's side from its inception in 1983. A number of players have represented nationally as either first 15, travelling reserves or long listed members of Canadian National Women's teams including: Doreen Whalley - 1987; Simone Ramdwar, Colleen Horton, Heather Miller and Barb Dawes - 1988; Brenda Treleaven - 1988-89; Val Gompf - 1988-91, April Gobert - 1990 and U-19 listed Crystallee Grouette and April Tremblay in 2000. The club also went on many tours in Canada and North Dakota, and in 1987, ventured overseas to England, Wales and France for games against Oxford, Blaneau-Gwent, Loughborough, London Wasps and Chilly-Mazarin.




The WWAA has been instrumental in developing women's rugby over the years. In addition to mini/youth rugby development, many members have been involved in coaching at both rural and city high schools including: Springfield, Fort Richmond, Dakota, Glenlawn, Elmwood, Vincent Massey (Brandon), and Minnedosa Collegiate. The club can be proud to see their lineage in many of the teams and clubs (Brumbies) the WWAA members have helped to develop.

The WWAA was a great organization that promoted women in sport for 34 years. Regrettably it was dissolved after the 2010 season. The women's rugby team continues to thrive and has found a new home with the Wasps Rugby Football Club.

Because of its role in developing and promoting women in sport, and specifically women's rugby in Manitoba, the Wasp Women's Athletic Association is a worthy inductee to the MRHOF in the category of Builder.




St. Paul's High School Rugby Program - Builder

The rugby program at **St. Paul's High School** was established in 1985 by Kevin Booth, an alumni/teacher at the school who was later to become Vice-Principal. The program has grown and strengthened since its inception and has annually fielded between 3 and 5 teams involving some 70 to 120 high school players. From the start, the school's policy has been "no cuts, all participants welcome, no exceptions"; a philosophy truly representative of the game of rugby.

In the early days, Kevin was assisted by Ron Vanderhooft, Ian Millar, Michel Khan, Al Carruthers, Stacey Dainard, Gennaro and Luca Macchia. Michel Khan served as head coach in the mid-1990's, to be followed by Nathan Cole from 2003-2006 and Perry Cole from 2007 to the present. Their leadership and the strength of the program were aided by many others who provided coaching assistance and with the full support of school administration, teachers and staff.

Many players have developed their skills at St. Paul's and played on as adults with other local clubs, Provincial team programs and on representative sides throughout the world. Many more have learned about the game of rugby and have spread its message and shared their positive memories far and wide. Alumni from the school have and continue to contribute to the functioning of Rugby Manitoba, as coaches, officials, Board members, members of Maple Grove Rugby Park and more.



The St. Paul's High School Rugby Program has won numerous provincial school championships, beginning in 1986 and continuing repeatedly and regularly to the present. They have also toured to Northern Ireland, Ireland, Scotland & Ireland, Connecticut, Dallas, Kansas City, Colorado, Montreal, Washington D.C., and South Africa, serving as fine ambassadors of the game and for the province of Manitoba throughout the world.

The St Paul's High School Rugby Program has and continues to significantly contribute to the growth and development of rugby both in Manitoba and throughout the world.



The FIRST rugby inductee into the Sports Manitoba Hall of Fame!

John Reilly Rugby/Builder



The first Rugby inductee into the Sport Manitoba Hall of Fame, John "Kiwi" Reilly was co-founder of the Brandon Barbarians Rugby Football Club in 1981, served on the Executive for 28 years in numerous capacities including President, and was a force in the development of rugby in Western Manitoba. Following his untimely death in 2009, the North Pitch of Brandon's Canada Games Rugby Park was renamed Reilly Field in recognition of his many contributions to the game. An exceptional player in his own right, Reilly played the wing as well as the hooker position. He was co-chair on the National U-18 Championships and helped develop world class rugby fields for the 1997 Canada Summer games in Brandon.





Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame Induction Guidelines

Purpose

- To celebrate the history of the sport of Rugby in Manitoba by recognizing those whom have significantly contributed to the Game.
- Categories
 - Plaver/Team
 - Official (Referees, Coaches, Managers and Non-coaching Staff)
 - Builder (Administrators, Media, Patrons, and Volunteers)
 - Pioneer (contributions should, but not necessarily, be prior to 1980)

General Criteria

- Nominees should have been involved in Rugby at least 20 years and have contributed significantly to the sport of rugby in Manitoba.
- Player nominees must have been retired for at least three years from a national or provincial team program.
- Nominees may be recognized posthumously.
- Nominees may be considered while holding elected office at the provincial, national or international rugby board level.
- Nominees will not be considered for induction while serving on the Manitoba Rugby Hall Of Fame Committee in the following positions:
- Committee Chair, Sub-Committee Chairs and Induction Sub-Committee Nominations Coordinator and Selections Jury members.

Nomination Procedure

- Nominations can be provided on-line or via downloadable form.
- The Nominator may be asked by the Induction Sub Committee to provide additional information and/or documentation concerning the Nominee.
- Nominations for induction are valid for a period of three years (once a nominee is deemed eligible).
- Nominations not recommended for induction within the three year period of nomination validity may be re-nominated; otherwise Nominations recommended for induction stand in perpetuity.

Selection Process

- Nominations will be considered by the Induction Sub Committee and any subsequent recommendations for induction are subject to ratification by the Rugby Manitoba Executive and final approval by the Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame Committee.
- Criteria for evaluation should include:
- Accomplishments
- Honours received
- Involvement with the game
- Overall career
- Recognition of their contribution(s) by club, union and community (local, national and/or international).
- Inductees will be announced in late spring/early summer, prior to their induction in the fall.

Number of Inductees

• Maximum of ten inductees annually.

Timelines

- Nomination Receipt Ongoing all year Ongoing all year
- Nomination Research
- Nomination Evaluation End May
- Nomination Recommendation Mid June
- Nomination Ratification End June
- Nomination Approval Mid July
- Nomination Announcement End July
- Nomination Induction Mid October

Removal

 If an inductee brings the Game in disrepute, including by a criminal action, the Selection Committee will review the situation and make a recommendation for retention or removal, conditional upon the approval of the Rugby Manitoba Board (not only the Executive).

Induction Sub-committee

- Chairman (appointed by the Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame Committee).
- All appointments by the Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame will normally be for a two-year term for the purpose of continuity.
- Honourable Member/s of the Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame.
- Independent non-rugby community representative.
- One Manitoba Rugby Club Past-President.
- Minimum one past president of either: Rugby Manitoba, Maple Grove Rugby Park, Manitoba Association of Rugby Referees, Manitoba Rugby Club in good standing.
- Alumni Representatives two former players or officials (one male, one female) who have been retired from the game (on the field) at least five years.

Revision

• These Guidelines are subject to revision by the Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame Committee, who will provide a copy of the revised Guidelines to Rugby Manitoba

Relationship between the Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame and Rugby Manitoba

• The Manitoba Rugby Hall of Fame is an independent organization, and is at arms-length from Rugby Manitoba, with no reporting relationship (other than for informational and liaison purposes) to Rugby Manitoba.
